


the clothespins – 2006 Le mollette Pencils on paper – cm 60x48,5

"With ascetic humbleness and rigorous tenacity, unmindful of trends, Beatrice Cignitti carries on her own route, being the sole use of pencils, ergo graphite, her favorite research area. In the primordial force of drawing, "divine art" according to De Chirico, she seeks the sense of an image crossed and carved by a "negative" light, which becomes mental space, personal memory. An obscure space but at the same time snatched away from obscurity by revealing glares, in which form is patiently sought in the dialectic between black and white, shadows and voids. It emerges from the vague continuum of reality, mysterious and, paradoxically, dazzling. Beatrice Cignitti finds a source of solace in the fragile

forms surfacing from the darkness, facing the inevitable night which threatens our existence."

Surreal emotions are those that the artist Andrea Felice imprints in support, pictorial narratives in which avant-garde techniques blend with pictorial studies, in order to give voice to a poetics of emotions capable of reviving the past in the modern era. The works of the artist Felice remind us of being children of history, as underlined by the evocative landscapes immersed in the ruins, the glimpses of an eternal Rome, the reinterpretation of the Sahara in which the link between history and the projection of an exciting future is constant, which is revealed in the insertion of fantastic elements: dragons, spacecraft, characters who came out of the pages of Carl Barks' comics and able to transport the observer on those immersive journeys proposed by Felice's art. 
Underwater IX - 2022

Contemporary artist who tells fragments of inner life. His paintings are a border between matter and spirit In his paintings the colors break down and recompose the artist's interest in the sensory and emotional dimension. A painted narrative sequence, characterized by the constant presence of figures in bathing suits depicted in isolated spaces such as unexplored places of the mind. Each figure of Mariella Gentile is conceiving what will be her own immersion, understood as a physical action but also an emotional and renewing one. In this process of rebirth, water and oxygen play a fundamental role, vital elements without which one cannot live. And these two elements represent the "fil rouge" of each painting. The artist layers color and paper on the canvas using different techniques: acrylic colors, chalks, pastels, charcoal, fusaggine, gold and silver leaf, giving life to real emotional stratifications in which Gentile tells about himself, fragments of personal life translated into painting.

Mere Godoy Guatemala, 1970 Her artistic studies begin through the use of acrylic, watercolor, porcelain, and the traditional Sumi – e technique. However, her work transforms into three – dimensional media after experimenting with wood, clay and stone, serving as a foundation for her current formal explorations in resin and metal.

Building from past material and compositional experiences, Mere creates mixed – media transfigurations that give quotidien and traditional objects a unique meaning, whether expressed through scale, form or materiality of choice.

Participating in various national and international collectives, her work portrays those moments of sweetness in life, which transcend time and stop being simple stories: becoming works of light, color, and joy. With elements of Guatemalan folklore, nature, and ladders, her work captures metaphors of life through sculpture.

Emmanuele Villani Born 1962, Milano, Italy is a sculptor, loving to show his ideas and thoughts in three-dimensions. His objects are presented in various sizes, starting from the very tiny Moon Drops, a lunar seven water-fountain project wrapped up in a ten millimeter sphere, now flowing in a real space gallery (moongallery.eu) rising up to furniture pieces like chairs, lamps, cupboards sofa and bigger objects, as well as complete interior design suggestions and development or even big architectural boxes. This long lasting research is focused in exploring interiority of human being, and all the projects always have a exterior and interior development and shaping. Handling, tasting, smelling the curves, touching the materials and watching light reflections are intentional feelings to be searched as intimate secrets, suggesting a path to discover a unique, intimate and personal sensation. The Oleum Series rise from observing minimal details in everyday life, in this case the inconvenience of oil drops coming out from a cruet when used, a bothersome inescapable event. A steel and copper metallurgical shaping of the handle intend to force the drop to go back where it came from.

Grano Salis and Grano Piper are a couple, trying to rise from all the objects of the table set, enabling the user to smoothly scratch salt and pepper.

monogramma is located in via margutta, the famous artists' street a few steps away from piazza di Spagna and Piazza del Popolo in Rome. The gallery has always supported the work of Italian artists by presenting them to the international public, while at the same time maintaining a fertile dialogue with national and international museum institutions, also promoting relations between galleries, critics, curators and collectors. In November 1976, a space for art was born in Reggio Calabria.


It grew rapidly and became an artistic forge of initiatives, ideas and proposals. In November 1996, this twenty-year experience, matured in between reality and illusion, moved to Rome by starting its first meeting with "Exempla". For several years now, monogramma has aimed at the international market, presenting its artists at the fairs and the galleries of Milan, New York, Singapore, Seoul, Hong Kong, Stockolm, Tokyo and London. Even the Italian cultural institutes abroad in London, Malta and Miami, have hosted exhibitions curated by monogramma, who have always wanted to internationalise their artists. monogramma, owner of the "via margutta" brand, also wants to bring the historic via dell'arte back into the limelight, through some cultural initiatives on the street: the margutta prize and ModArt, within which it shows contemporary art through art performances.
