The 10 Best Places to Visit in Milan

The Duomo, the Magnificent Ghibelline

The Duomo di Milano, the largest cathedral in Italy, is a masterpiece of Gothic architecture. Its construction took over 600 years and its façade is rich in sculptures and mosaics.

Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II, the Heart of Milan
